You were an ambassador of choice for the values of our association and its motto "service through friendship". For you had an innate sense of service and duty, and you were one of those people who keep their word. To commit oneself to you was truly to become part of a team. And the IPA delegates made no mistake when they elected you four years ago to the IEB as Chairman of the now International Relations Committee. I want you to know that you were a perfect team player, eager to do your job and support the team!

But beyond your community work, you were, as I said, Einar the man of honour, Einar the man of his word, and above all Einar the man of friendship. But you also touched us enormously by the family man you were. Your wife and daughters were your infinite treasures, and you never failed to mention them with this light of pride and happiness in your eyes.

Einar, from the bottom of my heart, and associating the IEB, the IAC and the whole IPA family with this message, I say a heartfelt and emotional thank you.

From where you are, keep a watchful eye on your family, but also on us. Know that your place in our hearts is a special one, and that we will never forget who you are and who you have been for all of us.

TRINIDAD & TOBAGO FOUNDING MEETING

It with great joy I can write to you regarding the new member of the IPA family – Section in Foundation IPA Trinidad & Tobago. I am happy to welcome them in my capacity as Secretary General on behalf of the IEB and the rest of the IPA sections.

OFFICIAL PROGRAM

On the 8th September 2023 the Founding meeting of IPA Trinidad & Tobago took place in Port of Spain. The location was at one of the Police Colleges where on the very same day the Police cadets had just finished the traditional "Duck Race".



We gathered in the big hall and many happy and anticipating Foreign Associate Members of IPA USA Region 101 filled the room and seats. The National Anthem was played on a steel pan and many of the participants sang along. The Police Band provided the entertainment for the rest of the meeting.

The Police Commissioner, Mrs. Erla Harewood-Christopher had to remain in the office due to an ongoing kidnapping case, however she kindly sent her Deputy Police Commissioner Mr. Simon to the meeting. We had the opportunity to meet all the heads or deputies of the different police, custom, prison and traffic services at the islands. Once the opening of the meeting took place, there was +70 participants and around 45 IPA members seated. Of course, the ongoing real time cases arising took priority and therefore there were not as many as hoped to join. A relatable likeness to police life is in every country around the world.

All honorary persons were welcomed along with several members who had brought the IPA to Trinidad & Tobago in early 2000s. The interim National Board were elected as returning National Board of the section. The Bylaws were passed without discussion as they had been circulated to all members and amended in accordance with the International Statutes. Confirmations of support were forwarded by the Deputy Commissioner Mr. Simons and additional confirmation of membership of the United Nation and that all Police officers working in accordance with the UN Declaration of Human Rights. The sponsor section IPA USA forwarded their greetings via Zoom and US National President Mr. Joe Johnson wished T&T all the best for the future and confirmed his support for them to start their section in foundation. At this point I informed the participants and the re-elected President Mr. Curtis S. Belford and his national board, the decision made by the IEB at the

meeting in South Africa in June 2023 – to accept the FAMs in Trinidad & Tobago and to go ahead with the Founding Meeting.

Documents were signed and when all was complete, a big applause broke out in the room. The handshake between the Secretary General and the National President underlined the decision made and the certification along with the IPA flag (last of the old logo) and some other small items for the members to enjoy were handed over. History was written for the FAMs in T&T and for IPA worldwide. A new section is growing in South America and the smiles on their faces showed how strong they are in their belief of the future.

We all took photographs and of course then had time to celebrate with a traditional meal, drinks, and dancing.

Next morning, we were brought to the "Red House" which is the Parliament in T&T. We met with one of the officers on call who guided us around the building

which is an art exhibition. The two chambers were to be opened the following week after the summer break and there were several other rooms with beautiful art and furniture. This was the same in the staff kitchen, dinner room and resting areas. We had a walk past the memorials and the history of Trinidad & Tobago was extensive. IPA JAPAN - PARTICIPATION IN FRIENDSHIP EVENT IN FRANKFURT

From 23 to 27 August, I, a member of IPA Japan Kanagawa Region, participated in a five-day friendship event, "International Meeting of Police Officers", organised by IPA Germany in Frankfurt. The event brought together police officers from 12 countries, mainly those that have a town twinning with Frankfurt or Hesse. They were Belgium, Denmark, France, Great Britain, Hungary, Israel, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Romania, Ukraine and Japan.

This article is my experience of the event. I would like to thank the organisers for the excellent programs and for giving me the opportunity to meet many wonderful IPA friends from around the world and from Germany, as well as the high-ranking officials and distinguished guests.



Day 1

I had already booked my flights in March, five months before the event, and was really looking forward to meeting IPA friends working as police officers in other countries. I had no previous experience of interacting with them. On August 23, the day of my departure, my flight was scheduled to leave Haneda International Airport shortly after midnight, but I was so excited that I couldn't wait through the night and arrived at the airport around 6 p.m. the day before. My first stop from Haneda was Dubai in the United Arab Emirates, where I changed planes for Frankfurt. Arriving at Frankfurt International Airport after a long journey, I was warmly greeted by two uniformed German officers who kindly took me to the hotel. That evening we had dinner at a traditional German restaurant, and I met the organisers, some guests and other participants. I had a dish called "Schnitzel", which is fried pork like Japanese "Tonkatsu", and it was very tasty.



Day 2

We put on our national police uniforms and attended the official reception at the Frankfurt Police Headquarters, where we met the Chief of Police and the President of IPA Frankfurt. We then visited the Communication Command Centre, the Crime Museum and the IPA Cellar. In the cellar we found pictures and objects from over 40 years of IPA Frankfurt history. This was followed by the official reception in the Kaisersaal, where the successive Holy Roman Emperors held their post-coronation dinners. During the reception, the Mayor of Frankfurt told us about the purpose of organising this event, including the meaning and importance of international police solidarity.

Day 3

We visited "INNOVAION HAB 110", which contributes to the digital transformation of the Hessian police by supporting the development and implementation of digitalisation and IT projects. What impressed me was not only their work, but also their attitude. They said, "We are all colleagues working towards the same goal of protecting the security of our countries. If you want to know more about us, even after you return home, you can always ask us," and gave us their contact details. One of the aims of organising this delegation was to give participants the opportunity to deepen mutual understanding and cooperation. They showed us what we need to do for the future, and I was impressed by their determination to build great international relationships and pass them on to the next generation.

to the organisers and my new friends and headed for the airport. I was very sad to leave them, even


though we had only known each other for five days.

Los temas tratados tuvieron los contenidos Siguientes:

Seguridad ciudadana humanocéntrica

La seguridad ciudadana es un bien jurídico y social esencial en la sociedad democrática contemporánea y un derecho humano consustancial de todo ciudadano sin distinción alguna, cuyo núcleo se centra en las vidas humanas, la libertad de actuación de las personas sin restricciones ilegítimas y la dignidad humana. La seguridad ciudadana no debe ser estadocéntrica, vale decir que esté en función a la protección del



estado y de los intereses nacionales, sino que la seguridad ciudadana debe de ser humanocéntrica, vale decir focalizada a proteger a la persona humana, a todos los ciudadanos, ellos son su prioridad. Los ciudadanos deben de estar libres de temor y de necesidad.

Seguridad ciudadana y desarrollo humano sostenible

Se esbozó en el evento un concepto más amplio de la seguridad ciudadana del siglo XXI que está en función al desarrollo humano sostenible que contempla respeto a los derechos humanos, promoción de la justicia social, lucha contra la discriminación, la pobreza y la ignorancia, respeto al medio ambiente, erradicación de la violencia, participación, pluralismo, y lucha contra la corrupción e impunidad.

Policía de proximidad ciudadana o policía comunitaria

Reflexión final del Congreso:

IPA POLAND - CrimART FROM KRAKOW



History shows that a very high risk of losing all cultural goods is posed by armed conflicts, during which there is a loss of control over museums, collections of works of art and other facilities where they are collected, and as a consequence - their looting, export to the territory of other countries and ultimately devastation or concealment. In turn, in times of peace, cultural goods are a tasty morsel for criminal groups.

The awareness of the above threats is the basis for the idea of organising a series of conferences devoted to the protection of cultural goods and CITES specimens and species (the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora, also known as the Washington Convention or CITES for short, was drawn up in Washington on March 3, 1973, which the Republic of Poland ratified by accession to the Convention on December 12, 1989. It entered into force in Poland on March 12, 1990). Important elements of the project were its comprehensiveness in terms of cooperation between many services and institutions dealing with the protection of these values and the international nature of the project. Only by institutions and strengthening merging many cross-border cooperation is it possible to act effectively to protect these invaluable values. Project titled "Crime against cultural property and CITES - CrimART", initiated by officers and employees of the Provincial Police Headquarters in Krakow and financed by the Internal Security Fund (LSF Police), is the Polish Police's response to these challenges. Members of the Małopolska Provincial Group of the International The International Police Association.

The organisation of symposia, meetings and seminars, as well as the promotion and conduct of group and individual study trips aimed at increasing the knowledge of officers are included in the objectives of this organisation. The involvement of IPA members in the implementation of CITES training is another step in implementation of the association's goals. Thanks to these activities, police officers will be able to protect the cultural and natural heritage of our country even more effectively.

The project was joined by the Moldovan and Cypriot police and the University of Public Administration in Bremen. The National Tax Administration became the national partner. The first stage of the project were two international conferences organised on April 25-29 and May 23-27, 2022 in Krakow.



Over 90 people took part. Among them were representatives of the Małopolska Police and representatives of Cyprus, Spain, the Netherlands, Moldova. Germany, Romania and Slovenia.

The speakers were representatives of the Polish services - the Police. National Tax Administration and Border Guard. and the Ministry of Culture and National Heritage. Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań. The Auschwitz-Birkenau Museum, the National Museum in Krakow, the National Maritime Museum in Gdańsk and the Ethnographic Museum in Krakow.

In addition to a series of lectures, study visits were organised to the National Archives in Krakow and the Wawel Royal Castle, which were intended to practically expand the knowledge of project participants in the field of verifying the originality of works of art and their state of preservation, as well as analysing cases of forgery, damage and destruction of historic objects.

The next stage of the project was a conference organised on October 10-14, 2022 in Bremen, Germany. The organiser was the University of Public Administration, Hochschule fur Óffentliche Verwaltung Bremen. The speakers included university lecturers and representatives of the German Police. The program included lectures on the fight against organised crime against property and illegal trade in cultural goods and CITES. The participants of the training were officers of the Police Headquarters in Krakow and representatives of the Cypriot and Moldovan Police.

On November 1-3, 2022, the training was organised by the Cypriot Police. The topics covered were issues related to combating money laundering resulting from illegal trade in cultural goods, protection of cultural goods and cooperation with non-police institutions. Presentations as part of the training were given by representatives of the Cypriot services: Police (with the participation of lecturers from the Police Academy), customs and the prosecutor's office. The lectures were supplemented with a practical part, including a case study, and study visits.

The last series of trainings was organised by the Moldovan partner. The conference in Chisinau took place on February 7-9, 2023. Issues related to the protection of cultural heritage in the Republic of Moldova, the specificity of investigations into crimes of vandalism against cultural heritage and organised international crime concerning cultural goods and values were discussed.

multispectral research techniques used to detect counterfeits using non-invasive tests. The training

participants had the opportunity to visit the Technical, Forensic and Forensic Expertise Center, where they took part in a demonstration of equipment used for the examination of cultural goods.

Conference summarising the project held on May 29-31, 2023 in Małopolska. The participants included local police officers and representatives of the National Tax Administration. Border Guard and services from Cyprus. German. Romania and Italy. The goals achieved were discussed, as well as the areas in which international cooperation still needs to be improved. KAS and Border Guard officers as well as representatives of the Ethnographic Museum in the Krakow, Auschwitz-Birkenau State Museum in Oświęcim and the National Archives in Krakow also spoke, pointing out on the example of cooperation between the Ethnographic Museum in Krakow with the Border Guard and the National Tax Administration in specific matters - what real benefits The development of a platform for cooperation between museums and services in the field of protection of cultural property may bring about this.

Considering the war in Ukraine, which broke out just before the project began, this issue has become even more relevant. The armed conflict in Ukraine shows how easily cultural and animal goods can be destroyed as a result of hostilities. Media reports show that Russian troops are consciously destroying Ukrainian monuments and religious buildings. Armed conflict has a negative impact on wild animals in many aspects. Due to food shortages, these animals are killed and sold on the black market, which poses a threat to their population. Armed conflict often undermines wildlife protection. In times of war, it can be difficult to provide adequate care and protection for animals. It should be emphasized that law enforcement agencies of other countries have a key role to play in the protection of monuments and wild animals in Ukraine. These activities are important for the preservation of Ukraine's cultural and natural heritage.

IPA POLAND - CrimART FROM KRAKOW

Ukrainian law enforcement agencies cannot properly protect monuments and animals during war for several reasons. First, war consumes enormous resources that could be devoted to protecting these areas. Secondly, warfare often makes access to places containing monuments and animals difficult. Thirdly, war may lead to an increase in crime, including crimes against monuments and animals. Additionally, please remember that Ukraine's law enforcement agencies are currently busy fighting other types of crime, including organized crime, drug trafficking and terrorism.

Therefore, they have limited opportunities to devote attention to the protection of monuments and animals. In order to protect monuments and animals in Ukraine, law enforcement agencies of other countries cooperate with Ukrainian law enforcement agencies. This cooperation includes, among others: collecting evidence and certificates of crimes, prosecuting criminals and educating the public about threats to monuments and animals.
