



Dear friends,

IPA are committed to supporting the next generation of members and this will be achieved through our young members' projects. There are currently two projects, Young Police Officers Seminar (YPOS) and Strategic Young Members Conference (SYMC) aimed at Young members in the IPA. The aim of these events are to strengthen young members in responsible positions within the International Police Association worldwide and strengthen bonds between the represented sections. They encourage exchange and meetings between International Young Police Officers, assist with the Recruitment and Retention of members and Identify promotion possibilities. It also provides an opportunity for exchange of knowledge and best practice between serving police officers. From 29th July - 3rd August 2024, the Young Police officers Seminar and the Strategic Young Member's conference took place in conjunction with one another in Vienna Austria where 39 attendees from 26 sections were present.

The following feedback was noted during these events, and I feel it is fundamental to share the feedback of our young members with our sections to learn from our members and to better understand their needs. I hope you find this document useful and I encourage you to see if any of these suggestions can be implemented within your section.

An overview of IPA was shared with participants and the structures of the National and Regional branches of each section. The roles and functions of the board were explained. This was largely new information for delegates, so we need to consider how we help our members understand the structure of our organisation and the responsible positions available.

Professional Commission

- YPO's would like to understand the professional status and accreditations of the courses available and by whom they are delivered
- YPOs seek professional investigation courses which can be used for police duties in home police forces. These should be delivered by universities or accredited professionals
- Translation of courses would be desirable
- Financial costs of courses covered and police forces receiving reimbursement to send participants
 Certification that can be added to professional portfolio of participants as police officers in their
 home police forces
- YPOs feel the #SHEisIPA project is discriminatory in nature against men They encourage the opportunity for more YPOs in National boards/ Regions and branches.
- More gatherings and regional events for young members to interact with IPA. Enhanced cooperation with police units and colleges
- On Patrol events are highly desired
- More YPO centric events consider running YPOS more than once per year in more than one location i.e. Europe
- If SYMC remains as a part of the YPOS programme consider allocating more time and potentially extending SYMC by another day.
- Provide Opportunities for remote countries to attend YPOS even if this is for a shorter number of days or participation online. Possibility of attending SYMC only

International Relations Commission

- Invite & Involve Young Members with the experienced members enabling combined experience and new views
- Cross Border Crime co-operation utlise contacts within IPA & appoint IPA officers as official points
 of contact to gather information quickly with agreeed co-operations i.e intelligence co-operations if
 appropriate
- Appoint an IRC liaison officer specifically appointed to promote IPA. High visibility and promotion of this role to encourage co-operation in exchanging policing methods.

Socio Cultural Commission

- IPA Games Arrange local level events under the IPA Games umbrella
- E-sport –Implementation of more E-sports such as FIFA & Walk the World
- World Police & Fire Games Participation in the world Police & Fire Games. Encourage training together and open it up to other Blue Light Services such as Ambulance
- IPA Travel Develop a Global app that encompasses the Hosting Book and include pricing for each property. Consider a trust pilot rating and ensure all properties can be booked online. Consider a prize draw for houses as a lottery prize, open to all members.
- Events Ensure visibility and invitation of national events with other international sections
- Art & Culture Hold national competitions initially and send winners onto the worldwide event.
- Charity Led Events & Green IPA Continue the tree planting initiatives and consider local area clean up
- World Football Tournament Advertise the new project well in advance to increase participation

Development

- Members App A huge development for IPA will be the development of an IPA app. To have everything in one place will be hugely beneficial and accessibility of travel forms will be much easier
- Event E-Registration As part of the app development, enable e-registration for all events. Make this simple to use and easy to navigate with searches available by section, region and event type
- Membership E-Registration Once the app is downloaded and user is verified allow E-Registration for members
- E-Forms Any forms should be available to complete as an e-form. Links in the app to smart forms for greater and easier reach
- Gifting consider support for local products as gifts & tie in Green IPA initiative where possible.
- Sponsorship Consider Local Sponsorships if appropriate
- Financial Costs Costs of events like World Congress to be examined and consider making such events every 2 years if costs are prohibitive
- Efficiencies Consider increasing costs of membership by €1; explain why be transparent on costs, costs are rising and this should be reflected in the levy
- Data Sharing Consider more sharing of information between sections. Cloud based storage to ensure secure keeping of membership figures etc

Marketing / Promotion / Social Media

- Social Media examination of policies where each Section conforms to an agreed global policy for all Social Media offerings
- Examination of the Corporate Identity of IPA to be included in every communication
- An agreed centralised Social Media strategy that is agreed by every Section
- Information dissemination It is recognised that members are not receiving all information and national boards are not disseminating information accordingly. We need to look how we can improve this
- Media Need for a general high end power point which can be used to impart the most important information about IPA in each Section
- Look at other options for information sharing as podcasts are considered out of date and young people do not listen to them
- Websites should conform to an agreed formulae each Section should present in the same way
 Suggested platforms for examination are DISCORD & SLACK
- Consider a standardised policy for instagram
- Short videos to be used across social media platforms
- Promotion Standard templates which can be utilised for all sections to promote IPA. Short videos communicating benefits of IPA and promotion of events to be used and shared with sections to use.

Mentor Programme

Delegates indicated that they would find a mentor programme of assistance to them and would welcome the opportunity to partake in such programme if this was available in their section. Section Ireland currently run this programme where each delegate receives a certificate in mentoring which is globally recognised as a requirement for police professionals going forward in mentoring roles with their probationary colleagues.
