IPA SEYCHELLES SECTION FOUNDED — A HISTORIC MILESTONE FOR THE IPA FAMILY

The founding meeting of the International Police Association (IPA) Seychelles Section on 15 August 2025 marked a historic milestone in the organisation's global expansion. The event reflected unity, commitment, and a shared vision to strengthen international police cooperation and regional collaboration.



From Re-Joining to Foundation

Seychelles re-joined the IPA in 2023 as a Section in Formation, under the sponsorship of IPA Mauritius. Before this, the Seychelles team successfully gathered over 100 FAMs under the umbrella of IPA Mauritius. With guidance from their sponsor, they fulfilled the IPA criteria according to the International Statutes and received a letter of support from the National Police Commissioner, confirming endorsement and permitting members of the Seychelles Police to participate in the international association.

IPA Mauritius played a central role throughout the process, supporting the Seychelles team in establishing an official committee, reporting on its development, and confirming that IPA Seychelles members had organised social, cultural, and professional activities. In 2024, IPA Mauritius formally requested recognition from the Secretary General of the IEB for Seychelles as a Section in Foundation. Guided by the Secretary General, the process culminated in the approval of a Founding Meeting by the IEB and the International President.

Mr. Martin Hoffmann, President of the IPA International Executive Board, opened proceedings, emphasizing the importance of local collaboration, integrity, and strong leadership. remarks His set positive, constructive tone and were warmly received.

All members took the oath, re-affirming their commitment to uphold the principles of the Association with integrity.

Key Ceremonial Moments

The meeting included:

- Signing of the IPA Declaration of Conformity, confirming compliance with the Procedure for Foundation and Affiliation of National Sections.
- Signing of the IPA Declaration of Human Rights, pledging commitment to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (United Nations, 1948).
- Signing of the new national statutes and the International Statutes.
- Awarding of the certificate of recognition for "Section in Foundation" by the International President and Secretary General.
- Playing of the Seychelles national anthem and the IPA hymn.

Distinguished guests included the Minister of Interior Fonseka, the Commissioner of Police, the International President, and the Secretary General, underscoring the significance of the occasion.

As the IPA celebrates its 75th anniversary I have just celebrated my 92nd birthday and 68 years of membership. Yes. I joined on the 7th of April 1957! So many memories!

My police career started as a cadet with the former Devon Constabulary in 1949, only to be interrupted by National Service when I found myself in Canada training to be an RAF pilot. Wings gained, I returned home to fly the RAF's early jets, the Meteor and Vampire.

Did I return to my police career? I chose the best, a permanent police career with the excitement of continued flying with the Reserves. I became a 'flying cop', a rarity 70 years ago! It must have influenced the Chief Constable for I was one of the Force's fastest promotions, gaining my sergeant's stripes at 8 years' service in an era when around 15 was the norm.

But back to the IPA when, in 1958, I learnt of the friendship which existed internationally. It was an era when charter flights and package holidays weren't even thought of so it was my trusty old Austin A30 which made the trip to Switzerland for Sheila and I to enjoy our honeymoon. On our homeward journey we stopped in Strasbourg to find an overnight hotel and as we did we were approached by a French policeman, probably eager to practice his English. When I said that I too was a policeman, and showed him my IPA card, he was all smiles. He insisted, no hotel for us but an overnight stay with his family. And so, a lasting friendship was formed.

Forward to 1967 when, on amalgamation, I found myself promoted to become the new Force's first Cadet Training Officer. I had a few revolutionary ideas and here the IPA was a great help. The first study tours had recently been introduced, and I was awarded an early one – to study recruit training at Nord Odal in Norway. Their hospitality was amazing, and I learnt much.

It's now the 1970's and when we entered the EU I was the Force Accident Prevention Officer. A road safety initiative I introduced at the time received much publicity in the national press, one of the results being my making a road safety film in France for an ITV company. The local French IPA gave much support. Another article for Police World!

The publicity this generated resulted in being asked if we could host an English police exhibition at the forthcoming Rennes International Trade Fair, one of France's largest. The French IPA were excellent, making many of the local arrangements and hosting our members with theirs for the duration of our stay. Many lasting friendships were formed and there was yet another article for Police World.

Then, in the late 70's, we hosted an American officer from California, 'Chuck' Conaway, who was on an IPA study tour with his wife, Mary-Jo. It became an enduring friendship, and we still swap emails. Post-retirement he went into the film industry, with several of his scripts made into movies. After retirement we met up with them in L.A. and were given a personal tour of Universal Studios as well as visiting many well-known locations.

I could go on but one must end somewhere. I've enjoyed 68 years of membership during which time as a serving officer I acted as our local branch treasurer, secretary and chairman. The latter was vacated on retirement in 1986 to enjoy, so far, a further 39 years on pension.

IPA SECTION KENYA'S VISIT TO PRECIOUS KIDS CENTRE, KITALE

On Friday, the 25th of July, 2025, the IPA Section Kenya left Nairobi City for a 400 km, eight-hourlong journey to the Western Kenya Region. The destination was the Precious Kids Centre in Kitale, where various items were donated. The Precious Kids management appealed to the IPA National Executive Board for assistance, which led to this travel. Individual IPA Section Kenya members generously donated the items, contributing either in cash or in kind to these charitable causes.

In 2012, the Centre commenced operations and welcomed its first child. Located in Kitale, Kenya, the Precious Kids Centre today serves 121 children with various disabilities to provide the support they need to learn, grow, and reach their full potential. Each child is cared for according to their individual needs.



The IPA team, under the leadership of the Association's President, Mr Jared Jared Ojuok, HSC, and members of the National Executive Board, including Secretary General Irene Kerubo, Deputy Treasurer Wilhelm Kimutai, and former Asst. Secretary General Mr David Wafula, was received by the Centre's Founder and Director, Ms Samantha Hammock, and a host of other directors. Members of IPA present included Annete Binyanya, Abdulzaid, Pauline Gatitu, and Wilson Omondi.

Additionally, Precious Kids Centre works to equip parents and educate the community to be more accepting and supportive of children with disabilities.



"The best way to support our children physically, emotionally, spiritually, and mentally is to donate to Precious Kids Centre." "Praying for our children, along with our housemothers, teachers, cooks, and counsellors, is equally important for continued support in meeting the needs of our children," Ms Samantha told the IPA Team.

"Our heart at PKC is to meet all of our children's needs," Ms Samantha appealed to the IPA team. "We are asking all of you to partner with us and with GOD'S HEART for our home as we care for over 115 children, manage frequent hospital visits, provide daily medications, offer therapy, and handle hydrocephalus shunt replacements, among other needs.

Our goal is to raise \$50,000 to cover our medical expenses for 2025! We believe that with YOUR HELP, every need we have will be met so that we can walk in God's calling for our home and continue to love and protect the children of Kitale!" She said.

The IPA team travelled from Nairobi and arrived at the home with goodies, including nappies, blankets, maize and wheat flour, beans, green grams, maize, rice, cooking oil, and cash donations; totalling USD 4,000/=.

The IPA Section runs a quarterly activity whereby members put together donations, both in cash and in kind, to support the less fortunate members of the community.

The centre's management expressed deep appreciation to the association's leadership and the patron, the inspector general of the National Police Service. Also present were local police command representatives.

IPA JAPAN SEMINAR



IPA PAKISTAN VISIT TO MAZAR-E-QUAID BY NEWLY ELECTED SECRETARY TARIQ JADOON



After the recent election of Mr. Tariq Jadoon as Secretary of IPA Sindh Region, a formal visit was organised to the mausoleum of Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah, the founder of Pakistan.

The visit was led by Mr. Khadim Hussain Rind, Chairman IPA Sindh Region-5 and Additional Inspector General of Police, along with other senior police officers and IPA members. On this occasion, special prayers were offered for the prosperity of Pakistan and for the global growth and unity of the International Police Association (IPA).

AID TRANSPORT BY IPA AUSTRIA CARINTHIA SUPPORTS EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION IN TAPOLCA



Hermagor/Tapolca – On the initiative of Ewald Grollitsch and the International Police Association (IPA) Carinthia, an aid transport with used school furniture was organized to the Hungarian town of Tapolca. The delivery is intended to benefit a school whose facilities are in urgent need of renewal.

The initiative was triggered by a request from Laszlo Sandor, a Hungarian IPA member and longtime acquaintance of Grollitsch. Representing the school principal, Sandor described the difficult learning conditions at the affected school in Tapolca. According to him, many pieces of furniture were damaged and barely usable. He asked for support in obtaining well-preserved furniture from Austria.

In response, the IPA Carinthia, under Grollitsch's leadership, launched a collection campaign. Several schools from Carinthia participated, including the middle schools of Hermagor and Lesachtal as well as educational institutions from Villach, Lurnfeld, and St. Veit. A total of 147 tables, 192 chairs, and 41 swivel chairs were collected and prepared for transport. From Lesachtal and Hermagor alone came 96 tables, 100 chairs, and 16 swivel chairs.

The loading of the furniture was carried out with the help of Hungarian parents who traveled from Tapolca specifically for this purpose. Coordination was handled through the parents' association of the Hungarian school. The transport was carried out by truck to Hungary.



This initiative is an example of cross-border cooperation in the field of education. For his commitment, Ewald Grollitsch received a certificate of honor from the municipality of Tapolca.

AN EXPERIENCE BEYOND THE UNIFORM



'Embracing an Inclusive Vision for the Future 2" held in IBZ Gimborn, Germany in April 2025.

The #SHEisIPA feature continues throughout the month of September and this month we hear from Fotini Plioska of IPA Greece about her experience of attending the #SHEisIPA seminar

Throughout the seminar, I had the opportunity to connect with women from various security forces, each with different backgrounds, yet all sharing similar concerns, values, and a common vision: to be heard, to be visible, and to have our contributions recognized. The talks, the experiential activities, and – above all – the honest, heartfelt stories touched me deeply. They led me to reflect not only on who I am as a professional but also on who I want to continue to be as a woman, a colleague, and a role model.

#SHEisIPA gave me a powerful sense of belonging. I wasn't alone. I realized that progress is possible when voices are united, when we break down stereotypes, and when we move forward with courage and solidarity. I left the seminar with renewed confidence, fresh ideas on how to help elevate women in our field, and – most importantly - a strong belief that change is not only necessary but achievable. Not in theory, but in practice.

Participating in the #SHEisIPA seminar was far more than just another professional obligation. It was a deeply personal, emotional, and - I dare say - transformative experience. As a female police officer, I am often called upon to balance the strength required by my role with the sensitivity that naturally defines me as a woman. #SHEisIPA reminded me that these two traits are not in conflict - they are complementary.





AN EXPERIENCE BEYOND THE UNIFORM

Actions like #SHEisIPA are essential. They are not just "seminars" – they are safe spaces for growth, expression, and empowerment. They bridge professionalism with human experience, and day-to-day work with long-term vision. Empowering women in law enforcement is not simply about numbers – it's about substance, fairness, and inclusion. And every step toward this goal deserves to be seen, supported, and strengthened.

I am deeply grateful to those who made this experience possible. #SHEisIPA wasn't just a milestone in my career. It was a powerful reminder that behind the uniform, there is always a human being. And that human being has a voice, strength, and the right to grow."

BREAKING BARRIERS TOGETHER: RUPINDER GILL IPA UK



Last year, when I joined the International Police Association (IPA), I was inspired by the passion behind the ShelsIPA initiative. This led me to attend the seminar Embracing an Inclusive Vision for the Future, a transformative experience that broadened my perspectives on representation and empowerment in policing.

Held in a stunning castle, the seminar brought together women in policing from across the world. As we introduced ourselves, I shared my challenges as an ethnic minority woman in UK policing, only to realise that others in the room faced similar barriers in male-dominated environments.

The speakers were truly inspiring. Retired Chief Superintendent Hannah Wheeler spoke about overcoming obstacles and shared valuable advice on imposter syndrome. Ruth Busby's work in diversity at Great Western Rail resonated with me, as it reflected changes that would have benefitted my late father, who spent his career in the rail industry. Kirsten De Jong important discussions on AI and policing, highlighting algorithmic bias and the need for technological fairness. Meanwhile, HeForShe advocate Liam Busby encouraged deeper support for women in policing, inspiring new collaborations within my own force.

Beyond the sessions, the cultural evenings were unforgettable. As a British Indian, it was important for me to represent my heritage. A highlight was dancing to Bhangra music in a castle, with delegates from 25 different countries enthusiastically joining in—a moment I will always cherish.

The seminar reinforced the importance of empowerment, resilience, and representation for women in policing. I am grateful to the IPA and my force for the opportunity, and I look forward to continuing this journey, using the knowledge and connections gained to drive meaningful change.

The joy that these children, these angels, bring to your heart is priceless.

I am truly grateful to have participated in this seminar and met unique people, colleagues from 25 countries, who are doing their best to cope with difficult situations and circumstances. #SHEisIPA project team has created a community of daily access where ideas are exchanged, a living movement that provides you with the opportunity for collaboration, solidarity and empowerment across the board.





THE CYCLING DETECTIVE: PEDALLING FOR FRIENDSHIP, PROGRESS AND POLICING INSIGHTS



What happens when a serving detective leaves the office, mounts a bicycle, and pedals across the globe—not in pursuit of suspects, but in search of better ways to police?

Detective Sergeant Alex Williams, known as The Cycling Detective, has stepped away from his role in the Metropolitan Police Service to embark on a unique global research journey. With over a decade of operational policing experience and a background in education, Alex is taking a career break to explore one pressing question: How can we learn to police better—together?

His route will take him across continents, visiting police forces, training institutions, and community initiatives. Through interviews, observation, and professional exchanges, Alex will examine how different countries approach officer training, professional development, and community engagement. The findings will inform UK policing practice and contribute to the evidence base for modern, responsive policing.

At the heart of the project lies the International Police Association (IPA), a global friendship organisation whose motto is Service through Friendship. Alex's journey, undertaken in celebration of the IPA's 75th anniversary, is as much about pedalling for friendship as it is about research. It is a demanding undertaking physically, mentally, and logistically-but one that symbolises the adaptability, endurance, open-mindedness required contemporary policing. Each turn of the wheels brings him closer colleagues communities whose stories have seldom been told, yet whose experiences could inspire change back home.



THE CYCLING DETECTIVE: PEDALLING FOR FRIENDSHIP, PROGRESS AND POLICING INSIGHTS

Upon completion of his travels, Alex plans to share his findings through articles, academic briefings, and presentations to stimulate discussion and inform practice. He also aims to pursue a Master's Degree in Policing and continue his active engagement with the Society of Evidence-Based Policing and the College of Policing.

For those in policing, Alex's work offers an opportunity to reflect on how shared learning and international cooperation can enhance our profession. His journey is a reminder that, whether on a bicycle or in a briefing room, we are stronger when we share experiences, challenge our perspectives, and work together.



IPA US Section Training Programme – Green Bay 2025

Introduction

Attending the IPA US Section Training Program had long been a personal and professional goal. After returning from dispatch to active patrol duty last year, I felt the need to refresh my policing skills. The program, held June 26–30 in Green Bay, Wisconsin, offered the perfect opportunity to do so.

Journey to Green Bay

Before arriving in Green Bay, I spent a meaningful day in Chicago, where I attended the wake of Officer Krystal Rivera, tragically killed in the line of duty. Her loss, like that of many officers worldwide, underscored the dangers we face daily. On the way north, I visited the Germantown Police Department and Fond du Lac, where I met Lt. Ryan Williams—survivor of the 2011 tragedy that claimed Officer Craig Birkholz. Meeting him was both humbling and inspiring.

Training Overview

The programme gathered 31 participants from across the world, including Australia, Belgium, Denmark, England, Gibraltar, Scotland, Northern Ireland, Japan, Kenya, Moldova, and Germany. Hosted at St. Norbert College in De Pere, Wisconsin, the training combined lectures, tactical practice, community engagement, and cultural experiences.

Day 1 - Professional Insights & Wellness

The programme opened with welcomes from Mayor Mike Walsh and IPA leader Joe Johnson. Presentations highlighted IPA's professional mission, IBZ Gimborn, and the importance of officer wellness, particularly peer support for mental health. Alan Frazier delivered a session on drone technology and its applications in policing. The day ended with a tour of Lambeau Field, home of the Green Bay Packers.

Day 2 - Tactical & Firearms Training

At De Pere Sportsmen's Club, we trained in openarea threat response, handgun and rifle shooting, and tested pistols from Nelson Tactics. A friendly shooting competition closed the day, followed by a taco buffet.

Training at West De Pere High School focused on emergency first aid using tourniquets and active shooter response. In the evening, we visited Stubborn Brothers Brewery, where German brewing traditions met Wisconsin hospitality.



Day 5 - ASP Instructor Course & Closing

The final day featured hands-on instruction with OC spray, along with a presentation on the new Taser 10. A closing banquet followed, where participants received certificates of completion, marking the end of an inspiring week.

Reflections

The programme was a powerful blend of professional development, camaraderie, and cultural exchange. It deepened my skills, strengthened international bonds, and reminded me of the sacrifices made by officers such as Officer Krystal Rivera (EOW June 5, 2025) and Officer Craig Birkholz (EOW March 20, 2011). Their service and sacrifice remain an enduring inspiration.

The animators entertained the children with games and dances, and the organizers presented them with soft toys. As always, the delicious buckwheat porridge pleased the members of our association, their families and other guests.




